ABOUT US

Background and formation


Step Up for India is a non-government, non-political, non-profit making organization engaged in the field of education development since 2013. It all started with many of us independently volunteering in a few neighborhood government schools. We found that the English reading skills of the students in Std. 4 and 5 were significantly lower than the government textbook level. Impact was not proportional to our best intentions due to lack of cohesion between multiple teaching strategies. We realized that there was a need to teach English, using the strengths of the system, volunteers and students while addressing the unique constraints of the same three stakeholders. Thus, Step Up For India was born.

We design and implement English programs in resource-poor, non-English medium government schools and instill in students a sense of confidence towards independent learning. We provide comprehensive solutions to support students to reach their grade level proficiency in the shortest possible time while enhancing teachers' capacity to sustain the interventions.

We have partnered with the Department of Education, Karnataka, to deliver remedial assistance, resources, and training to make learning more effective, easy, and enjoyable. Working within existing frameworks, we understand ground realities and tackle them with precise interventions in a two-pronged, result-oriented approach.

During the academic year 2020-2021, we have implemented our English programs in 128 Government schools, benefiting 16592 students and 512 teachers with the support of corporate and individual donors and in collaboration with the Department of Education, Karnataka.

Our journey



Legal status

Step Up for India is a Public Charitable Trust incorporated under the provisions of the Indian Trust Act, 1882, Registration Number: 4/222, having Registered Office at # 166, 7th Main, KEB Colony, BTM layout 1st Stage, Bangalore – 560029, Karnataka State.

OUR PROGRAMS

1. Primary English Program:

The Primary English Program is a 120-hour program which is highly structured, and modular which is implemented in 4 terms of 30 hours for students in grades 4 and 5. The program draws upon the strengths of volunteers/coaches who are proficient in English and who would like to volunteer for short periods of time on a regular basis.

Channelizing the efforts of committed volunteers / coaches through a structured curriculum results in a deeply impactful academic program, which not only raises English literacy levels but also benefits the students by giving the confidence to continue learning independently. This is Step Up for India's flagship program.

We offer teaching and learning material that includes textbooks and workbooks, posters, white boards and stands, stationery, flash cards, props for plays, prizes for tests, volunteer instruction books and players.

2. Remedial English Accelerated Program (REAP):

REAP is specifically developed to support students of grades 6 to 8 who cannot read simple three-letter words like 'CAT', 'RAT', 'BAT' on the ASER test but they are expected to understand Greek Mythology and other higher form of text prescribed in their English textbooks. REAP was implemented only for those students who were not able to identify simple three-letter words in the ASER test.

Before implementing the program, we conducted the ASER test for grades 6 to 8 students. Those students from grades 6 to 8 who could not read simple three-letter words were identified to be part of the REAP. The number of students for each class of remedial instruction was limited to 40 students. Teachers were trained on REAP for two days and these teachers conducted 70 one-hour sessions for the identified students.

We offer teaching and learning material that includes teacher resource book for teachers and or volunteers, textbook and workbook for students, audio player with supportive audio tracks loaded on to an SD card, student sign-up sheets.


3. Study at Home Digital Outreach Program (SatH-DO):

SatH-DO is a 25-week program and is designed specifically to improve the basic foundational skills in English among the non-English medium students. By the end of 25 weeks, students will be taught over 500 words in English vocabulary, basic phonics, and conversation in English. This program engages parents even if they don't know English through the audio/video QR codes and simple instructions provided in regional language and English. The fun-filled interactive games in the book support students in a community to play together and learn English skills. Students, as well as parents, have shown a lot of interest in this program.

We offer teaching and learning material that includes teacher resource books for volunteers (non-Kannada teaching staff) textbook for students, an audio player with supportive audio tracks loaded onto an SD card, student sign-up sheets.

MODUS OPERANDI

The following flow chart gives a broad outline of the strategies we followed while implementing the programs in schools from pre-launch to end of the academic year.



The Department of Education, Govt. of Karnataka has requested the NGOs who were working in the Education sector to device strategies and programs to engage students during COVID. In response to the DOE's request, we developed SatH-DO Step 1 program and implemented the program from September 2020.

So the general modus operandi which is highlighted above is not followed during the COVID lock downs.

Pre-launch activities:

- Due to COVID lockdowns, most of the implementation activities happened over phone and Google meets.
- Discussed with the Block Education Officer, Block Resource Centre personnel, and Cluster Resource
 Persons of respective blocks, and explained to them about the SatH-Do Step 1 Program and got
 their approval to implement SatH-DO Step 1 program.
- Collected the contact details of all the Headteachers and English teachers in the selected schools.
- Created WhatsApp groups of all the parents' (who had smart phones) with teachers and HMs.
- Printed the SatH-DO books.

During-launch activities:

- SatH-Do books and phonics posters were sent to each Cluster resource center from the printer.
- The Headteachers collected the books and posters and distributed them to the parents when they came to collect the midday meals ration.
- Trained teachers online and during the training discussed with the teachers' various strategies to engage students through WhatsApp groups.
- SUFI Program Associates regularly called parents and ensured that they got SatH-DO books.

Post-launch activities:

- After the program launched, SUFI Program Associates regularly called students through the parents' phones and supported students to practice from the QR codes or from the bi-lingual support provided in the books.
- During the implementation, Christ University requested us if we can engage students for an internship program that could engage them online.
- We used this opportunity and trained 406 BBM students online.
- With the permission from the schools and parents, these students mentored students one on one over the phone.
- Conducted online refresher training to get feedback from the teachers.
- Shared progress reports with DoE along with testimonials from teachers and sessions videos.

End of academic year activities:

- Ensured the completion of the sessions in all the schools by the end of March 2022.
- We couldn't conduct the endline tests due to the lock downs.
- We conducted Focus groups discussions with the teachers and collected their feedback.

CONTENT RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

Research and development is one of the core values of Step Up for India. We strive to understand the ground realities, the challenges, and the opportunities to leverage accessible technology to address the challenges in the field of education.

Starting with our flagship program, the Primary English Program which was mainly delivered by the volunteers and paid coaches, we evolved over course of time and developed more scalable and sustainable programs implemented by teachers in the Govt. schools. The following are the key tenets of our research and development process.

- a. we have used best practices from around the world to design the base content in the context of the beneficiaries that we support.
- b. The evolution of each program has been an iterative process where we constantly revisit our implementation and content delivery even though we have a mature set of programs now.
- c. Our growth mindset and agility has allowed us to be very creative with our base content to cater to multiple existing constraints and tackle new challenges (like the pandemic)
- d. Our constant ask of the stakeholders students, teachers, govt officials, donors has always been to let us know how we can make their experiences better than what we have been able to give them. We are able to achieve this by focused group discussions, qualitative and quantitative measurements, active engagements, etc.


